

Jonathan Sieders (John Merrick) is excited to return for his third performance on the ACT stage! Previous credits include: The



Samantha Andrews playing the roles of Pinhead and Duchess is excited to be in this production of Elephant Man and is happy to work with a new director.





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THE ELEPHANT MAN FACTS Joseph Carey Merrick, also called the Elephant Man, (born August 5, 1862, Leicester, Leicestershire, England-died April 11, 1890, London) Merrick was apparently normal until about the age of five, when he began showing signs of a strange disorder that caused abnormal growths of much of his skin and bone. Merrick was confined to a workhouse at age 17, then escaped four years later to join Norman's Freak Show (1883) He wrote a short autobiography that was given out to the audience at shows. He enjoyed writing prose, poetry and letters. Dr. Treves believed he had died of asphyxiation. Over 100 years later, a newer theory suggested that Merrick's neck had dislocated under the weight of his own head, crushing his spinal column. In the 1980's movie, The Elephant Man, actual casts of Merrick were used to create an incredibly accurate depiction of his body. Top 10 Interesting Facts About The Elephant Man by Theta O'Neil False Greatness by Isaac Watts (Merrick's personal letters often concluded with this poem, which had particular relevance to him.) Tis true my form is something odd, But blaming me is blaming God: Could I create myself anew I would not fail in pleasing you. If I could reach from pole to pole Or grasp the ocean with a span. I would be measured by the soul; The mind's the standard of the man.

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
